Modern Slavery Statement

This statement constitutes our slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 2026.

We are committed to operating our business in an ethical manner, and to adopting working practices to ensure slavery and human trafficking does not take place anywhere in our supply chains. This statement is designed to set out the steps we have taken to ensure our business and supply chain is free from modern slavery.

We will respond to any reports about modern slavery promptly and take remedial action where required.

Our business

Our core business is conducting STS transfers of oil and gas around the globe. In addition, we also provide a variety of services including marine consultation, STS equipment sales and rental, QHSE management, training STS Mooring Masters and expert witness.

We employ approximately 22 permanent staff, of which there are 5 UK Directors (main Board) and 2 Regional Directors.

We also contract from a pool of approximately 8 specialist Mooring Masters to perform the STS transfers globally.

Our workforce

We are aware of the potential areas of exposure for modern slavery within our workforce, which we seek to manage in a number of ways:

- We review our recruitment processes and employment practices to ensure compliance with legislation and best practice
- We use reputable employment agencies for the supply of recruitment candidates
- We carry out Right To Work checks on all employees prior to employment
- We give our employees employment contracts and access to our policies at the outset of their employment, which amongst other things cover Equality, Diversity and Inclusion, Bullying and Harassment, Grievances and Whistleblowing
- We pay our employees more than the statutory minimum, and employee wages are paid directly into their bank account

- We encourage employees to report any concerns to senior managers or HR.

We also require our suppliers to complete due diligence questionnaires as part of our procurement process and we will review our supplier relationships to identify further ways in which we may be able to help eliminate the risk of modern slavery within our supply chain.
